



CONSORTIUM DIPLOMATIQUE EUROPÉEN

RULES ON DIPLOMATIC STATUS

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Introduction

These rules set out the conditions for obtaining, using and withdrawing diplomatic status in the Consortium Diplomatique Européenne (CDE). The aim is to ensure the responsible use of the status and to prevent any possible abuse.

Conditions for obtaining diplomatic status

Diplomatic status may be obtained only by Members of the organisation who meet all the conditions of membership. The candidate must undergo a security check and receive approval from the President of the organisation (executive board). The candidate must sign a declaration of responsible conduct and compliance with the laws of the host country and international rules.

Diplomatic status is subject to annual review and approval by the organisation.

Rights and duties of diplomatic status holders

- The right to use the diplomatic card and the associated insignia of the organisation.
- The right to use diplomatic vehicles and other benefits, depending on the position in the organisation.
- Duty to respect the laws of the host country and international agreements.
- Strict prohibition of abuse of diplomatic status to evade legal obligations or obstruct the work of state authorities.
- Duty to immediately report to the organization in the event of loss or theft of diplomatic cards or insignia.
- Diplomatic status is not automatically valid abroad – use must be in accordance with international rules and local regulations.

Withdrawal of diplomatic status

The organization may temporarily or permanently withdraw diplomatic status in the following cases:

- Violation of the laws of the host country.
- Proven abuse of status to evade punishment or inappropriate treatment by law enforcement agencies.
- Actions that could harm the reputation of the organization.

- Failure to comply with the rules of the organization and diplomatic conduct.
- Violation of security and protocol provisions related to the use of diplomatic insignia.

Procedure for revocation of diplomatic status

Revocation of status may be proposed by the President of the organization or the disciplinary committee.

The status holder must be informed in writing about the revocation procedure and have the right to defend himself.

The final decision is made by the disciplinary committee or the President of the organization.

After revocation of status, the holder must immediately return diplomatic insignia and documents to the organization within 14 days.

Failure to comply with this deadline may lead to further sanctions.

Sanctions for improper use of diplomatic status

- Warning - issued for minor irregularities.
- Temporary suspension of status - for repeated irregularities.
- Permanent withdrawal of status - in the event of serious abuse or harm to the organization.

Powers regarding the issue of diplomatic insignia

The President of the organization (executive board) decides which Members receive diplomatic insignia, including vehicles and documents.

The use of diplomatic insignia is permitted only for official purposes of the organization.

Any unauthorized use of diplomatic insignia is considered abuse and may lead to disciplinary proceedings.

Final provisions

Each holder of diplomatic status must sign a declaration of familiarization with these regulations.

- The regulations enter into force on the date of their adoption.
- Any changes to the regulations must be approved by the President of the organization.

With these regulations, the Consortium Diplomatique Européen ensures that diplomatic status remains a privilege that is used responsibly and in accordance with the law and ethical standards.
